

Fabric Care



The following guidelines are designed to help you care for your fabric display product(s). Following these instructions will greatly increase the life of your product.

IMPORTANT: Always handle fabric products with clean hands in a clean area. Gloves and a dropcloth are a good idea if you have access to them.

Storage

- Check for dirt or stains before storing your product. If necessary, follow the last set of instructions for stain treatment.
- If the fabric was recently washed, make sure it is completely dry before storing it.
- Fold the fabric along its seams so that the graphics are facing inward. Zip it up if it has a zipper, otherwise roll it up carefully.
- Be sure to put each piece in the same container it arrived in.
- Store in a cool dry area (40-80F).

Cleaning

- Machine washing, wash cold with low mechanical action.
- Drycleaning is also an option.
- Never tumble dry.

Stains

- Treat stains from the back when possible.
- Always start with the outer edge of the stain and move inward.
- Gently remove any dry stain material such as loose dirt with a soft bristled brush.
- Use a clean white cloth to blot as much of the stain as possible.
- Many natural stains can be removed with distilled water. Excess water can cause new stains or spread the original stain. Use with caution.
- If there is still a visible stain after rinsing with water, use the household cleaner that is most appropriate for the type of fabric and stain.
